





% of students furthering their education


% of students finishing their education after high school

% of students dropping out after high school






Percentage of students that start college or other degree seeking program the first year after high school graduation





Percentage of students from graduating class that finish a degree/certificate program in four years








Percentage of students from graduating class that start a college degree/certificate program and drop out within four years




