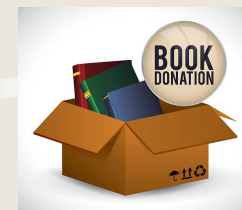
A HUGE thank you to each of your buildings for supporting the Allegan County Food Pantry Collaborative in the annual "Soup-tober" event.
