#### Strategy 1:

Assessment of Secondary Literacy skills - A process for assessing the literacy skills of secondary students and a plan for providing additional support, interventions, and instruction will be developed. The PSAT, and SAT have been identified for measuring and tracking progress in reading for middle and high school students. An deep analysis of the K-12 mathematics curriculum, including learning standards, instructional practices and assessment design, will be completed and revisions to the delivered curriculum implemented during the 2017/18 school year. Math Curriculum specialist from the Ottawa Area Intermediate School District will continue to work with grade level teachers to implement Common Core standards, to identify key concepts that are difficult for students (based on assessment data) and to implement effective assessment and instructional practices. Additionally, training in the use of data systems, including PowerSchool and ourschooldata (regional data warehouse) will be provided to enable teachers to more effectively collect and analyze student assessment data to target instruction and provide interventions and extensions for individual students.
