

Michigan's Proposal 1

What every citizen should know

On May 5, 2015, Michigan voters will head to the polls to vote on Proposal 1—a statewide ballot initiative that will fund improvements for Michigan's roads, bridges, and schools.

Proposal 1: What's it all about?

Proposal 1 is a complex plan with a simple set of goals

- Guarantee gasoline sales taxes go to repair roads, bridges and rail transit systems
- Protect and increase funding for K-12 schools and municipalities
- Provide tax relief for low-income working families

Proposal 1 promises for schools.

- **Safety:** Safer roads for busses and students who drive to school
- **Stability:** Limits raids on the School Aid Fund by constitutionally protecting 100% of SAF revenue for K-12 schools, community colleges, and career/technical education.
- **Resources:** Approximately \$300 million additional funds annually
- **Renewal:** New investment in transportation infrastructure will spur economic development, creating healthy, vibrant communities that attract more students to local schools
