JUNIORS TESTING OCT 19th

During the 2023-24 school year current Juniors will be taking both of the PSAT and SAT. <u>The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT)</u> will be taken on Oct 19th, 2023 and is generally viewed as a practice for the SAT, but it is also used to identify National Merit

Scholars. Like the SAT, it measures the knowledge and skills in reading, writing, and math students learn in the classroom—the same knowledge and skills your child needs to succeed in college and career. Student PSAT results could provide them with scholarships, lowered or free tuition along with other recognitions.

Juniors will be testing with their Summit Teachers while the rest of the students will have classes as normal. Testing should be completed by 11:00am.

Attendance Codes Updated 2023-2024

Absent (A)

The initial code recorded by the classroom teacher. If there has been no communication, robocalls will go out to parents/guardians at 8:45am and 1:15pm. By the end of the school day, all Absent (A) codes will be changed to one of the following:

Excused Absence (EA)

Excused Absence are all absences where medical documentation is not provided, but the parent <u>did</u> <u>communicate</u> the absence with the school attendance office.

- Students with an EA are <u>not allowed</u> to participate in extracurricular events, without prior administrative approval.
 - Work Based Learning opportunities, 4H, College Visits, Excused Medical Absences (Absence with Doctor's Note), are examples of absences that would still allow for student participation in extracurricular activities.
- Academic work missed as a result of an excused absence can be made up. It is the student's responsibility to contact the teacher(s) for make-up work.
- Excused Absences will still count towards the 10% absenteeism letters that are mailed out by the district school every 30, 60, 90, 120, and 150 days of school.

Unexcused Absence (UA)

Unexcused Absences are absences where the parent/guardian <u>did not communicate</u> with the school attendance office. Unexcused Absences may result in disciplinary action.

- Assessments and class work assigned on the day of an UA is not accepted and receives a score of O. Students considered unexcused or truant may not have the opportunity to make up work.
- Parents need to call, email, or send a note, by the end of the following school day of the UA to: • Have the absence changed from an UA to an EA.
 - Allow their students to have equivalent work time for the EA duration for assessments and work.

Excused Absence-Medical (EM)

These absences are determined with medical documentation turned into the school attendance office.

• Students with an EM are allowed to participate in extracurricular events

School Related (SR)

School Related Absences do not count toward Truancy. The classification is used for certain school-related absences.

Tardy (T)

Students arrive to class 1-10 minutes late. ***Excessive tardies may result in disciplinary action.
